More & more, we regard all who labor in the total field of alcoholism as our companions on a march from darkness into light. We see that we can accomplish together what we could never accomplish in separation & in rivalry."

I also appreciate how this pamphlet supports other service committees & their work. I don't think we can encourage enough the concept of being friendly with our friends inside the service structure of AA. This pamphlet states "Sound education on alcoholism, & far more of it at all levels, will clearly pay off." It takes us all to educate the public & make AA known & available to the suffering drunk.
