#### KEY ADVISORY ACTIONS PASSED AT THE 64TH GENERAL SERVICE CONFERENCE:

It was recommended that:

- 2. The following be presentation/discussion topics for the 2015 General Service Conference:

"Our Common Welfare through Gratitude in Action"

- a. Diversity in A.A. Our Heritage of Inclusion
- b. Safety and Respect Practicing the Principles Begins in our Home Group
- c. Safeguarding our Traditions through the Evolution of Technology
- d. Inventory Looking Back to Move Ahead

It was recommended that:

## **JUNE 2014**

#### C. <u>Cooperation with the Professional Community</u> It was recommended that:

The statement in the section Referrals from Court and Treatment Facilities to A.A. on page 4 in the pamphlet "If You Are a Professional..." is revised.

#### D. Corrections

It was recommended that:

A new video be developed to replace "It Sure Beats Sitting in a Cell" at a cost not to exceed \$70,000.

#### E. <u>International Conventions/Regional Forums</u> It was recommended that:

- 1. An anonymity-protected photograph of the flag ceremony be taken at the 2015 International Convention.
- 2. An encrypted, anonymity-protected Internet broadcast of the 2015 International Convention Opening Flag Ceremony be approved.

#### F. Literature

It was recommended that:

- 1. The revised pamphlet "Circles of Love and Service" be approved.
- 2. A correction to inaccurate text related to the addition of appendices on page XI in the Preface of Alcoholics Anonymous, be revised.

#### G. Policy/Admissions

It was recommended that:

1. During a two-year trial period the General Service Conference include one day of electronic voting on all nonelection votes.

#### H. Public Information

It was recommended that:

- 1. A new public service announcement be produced in 2014 at a cost not to exceed \$30,000.
- I. <u>Grapevine & Treatment Facilities/Special</u> <u>Needs/Accessibilities</u> No recommendations.

Happy 70th Birthday to our "meeting in print". 2014 is the year to celebrate our monthly magazine that is written and supported by AA members. No monies are received from group, district, or area contributions. We rely on subscriptions and book sales printed by the Grapevine, Inc.

Today the magazine comes without staples so they can be carried into jails and institutions. Some members are under the impression that the Grapevine is an outside entity and not part of Alcoholics Anonymous. It is true that the magazine is not conference-approved literature because of the lengthy edits required before actual print. Therefore, we are called the International Journal of Alcoholics Anonymous and recognized as a great recovery tool.

Are you aware of the **free daily quote** from the Grapevine that can be sent to your phone or computer? From this download, I learned a little history about the early days of our magazine.

AA Co-Founder, Bill W. in June 1959 wrote "An Anniversary Letter" in The Language of the Heart. It reads "The memory of some of those first editorial meetings will linger with me always." Seated around a table in a tiny cheerless room some place downtown, the founders pored over their freshly written copy for the first issues. In those days the enthusiastic founders did everything. Not only did they do the art work, write the bulk of the stories, they kept the books, they paid the printing bill, they typed the address on each copy and finally licked all the stamps. So went the happy monthly paroxysm of creating what was to become the principal monthly journal of our whole society."






SOUTHEAST TEXAS AREA 67
