History Corner

Nelson Newcomer: I was recently elected to be the secretary of our district. I was told it was an easy job. I prepared the minutes and was going to get them printed at my local print shop, but my D.C.M. told me that I don't get to select where the minutes are printed, and I have to pay to have them printed out of my own pocket. This just doesn't seem right or fair. Am I wrong to think that?

Angela Archivist: -- This questions touches on both Concept 10 and Tradition 7. Concept 10 reads: "Every service responsibility should be matched by an equal service authority – the scope of such authority to be always well defined, whether by tradition, by resolution, by specific job description or by appropriate charters and bylaws." Tradition 7 reads: "Every A.A. group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions."

In 1955, at the 2nd International Convention, Bill W. declared that A.A. has come of age. He thereby turned the fellowship over to the groups. Later, in 1962, the Delegates, serving as the elected representatives of the groups, adopted the Twelve Concepts, and granted to the trustees the authority to handle the day-to-day operations of the fellowship. The Delegates, however, still hold ultimate authority over the trustees by retaining the right to reorganize the board, if necessary. Trustees hold ultimate authority over the General Service Board's two service arms, AAWS and AA Grapevine. Directors of those two boards have authority over the officers of each. In all cases, such authority should never be used indiscriminately.

How does this apply to the districts and the groups? What are the group's trusted servants? Do you give them the authority to do their job, or tie their hands?

Every service responsibility, including secretary, should be well-defined, usually by a written job description, and that responsibility should be matched by equal authority, including where to get the minutes printed, unless, for example, there is a reasonable explanation of why a certain printer should be used, such as the district has a contract with a printer offering a great savings on the printing rate and offers to have them hand delivered to the meeting place. Otherwise, the secretary, or any other trusted servant, should have the authority to select where to get the minutes or other documentation printed. That makes doing the job possible. When we ask someone to be "of service" to the district, we have to allow that person to do the job in his or her own way

And our trusted servants must be, within reason, reimbursed for out-of-pocket expenditures made on behalf of the district, such as the cost of getting the minutes printed. Tradition 7 tells us that our groups should be self-supporting, declining outside contributions. This means that our districts and our areas are also self-supporting. Our groups provide funds to the districts to operate, and the district should pay its own expenses, and not expect our trusted servants to take money out of their own pockets to support district activities. This makes for a harmonious and effective operation of the organization from the top of the upside-down triangle, to the tip.

I hope that everyone who is not involved in service at any level will consider enhancing their sobriety by getting involved during this next 2-year rotation. It's not too late, and you will not believe how it will change your life for the better. It sure did mine!




