
Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God *as we understood Him,* praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.

My First Car

There have been many incidents where Alcoholism has caused me to lose or damage things in my life. When I think back, one of the first memories that always comes to mind is of my first car. I was 18 years old when I got my first car. It was a 1992 Park Avenue. I paid \$1,200.00 down and was supposed to pay \$100.00 a month for 3 months to pay it off. I was real [prod of my car; as soon as I got it, I put a new stereo system in it and some light tint on the windows. Boy, I thought I was the stuff! For the next 5 days, I went out every night to local parties and clubs to drink and show my car off, or I just drove around drinking, showing my car off. One day about 6 days after I purchased the car, I was sitting in it in some apartments, drinking. Someone came up to me and told me he had seen my license plate light was out when I drove into the complex. I was so wasted, I paid him no mind. Well, later on a friend of mine came around to see if I could drive him up the highway to get some beer. I agreed and when we were almost at the beer store, the sheriff pulled me over for a busted license plate light. When he began to question me, he could tell I was intoxicated and placed me under arrest for D.U.I. after refusing a breathalyzer. My so called friend was told he had to find a new way home, but not before he stashed some "other" substances in my ride. They found the

"other" substances and put some kind of lean on my car because of them. I didn't know how to fight the seizing of my first car and I lost it; all over trying to get some alcohol.

The second workshop I attended was on was called "Public Information Committees and Spreading the Message through Media Outlets." Having become involved with PI work just this year, I thought this would be a great resource for learning more that can be done to reach the still suffering alcoholic. An older gentleman stressed that it is important that we don't abandon "old" methods of publishing for newer technology; however, he thought that we can always be doing more work in all forms of media outlets. Fear is what seems to be holding us back from embracing the new technology (Facebook, Twitter, etc.). He stated that Bill W., Dr. Bob and many of the newer members faced these dilemmas back in the day with radio, television and publishing. Today, we have different means to reach people, but still the same fear!

I was so jazzed by the fact that I could contribute my own experiences to these workshops and that I could back it up with the knowledge I have learned over the years. I was also immensely proud of District 40 and Area 67. Having listened to other members from various districts and areas from all over the Southwest Region, I came to the conclusion that ours is the best! 
