Self Isn't' Always A Bad Word

When challenged with the topic of "self-forgiving or self-forgetting?" I had to first look at the definition of what those terms mean. Self-forgiving didn't seem too difficult. A rough definition is the act of ceasing to feel resentment towards oneself. So any guilt, shame fear, etc. I harbor within myself that makes me resentful at myself. I have to forgive myself from time to time for not being "perfect." I'm my toughest critic and when I don't live up to MY standards then I build up resentments towards myself. The crazy part is I'm the only one that is suffering. How It Works describes it perfectly as "progress not perfection" and "We are not saints!" If I have an expectation on myself to be perfect, then I've already set myself up to fail. When I don't meet these expectations, here come the resentments! Best thing I can do to maintain self-forgiveness is to remember that I'm not perfect and I'm not in charge. I need to remember to live in a state of flexibility. What works sometimes, doesn't work all the time.

Now, when it came to the self-forgetting part of this topic, I was a bit stumped. This is the point at which my favorite research buddy, Google, joined me. As best I could determine, self-forgetting is forgetting or not thinking of one's own advantage, interests, etc.; having or showing no thought of self or selfish interests. The 12 & 12 touches on this topic in Step 11, "What did he mean by "self-forgetting" and how did he propose to accomplish that? He thought it better to give comfort than to receive it; better to understand than to be understood; better to forgive that to be forgiven." What I understand from my findings, is that it's not all about me and what I want. When I can think about others, I self-forget. When I can forgive others, I don't spend time seeking out forgiveness. When someone is in need, I'm there for them and not expecting that they be there for me. So, self-forgetting is how I become of service without expecting anything in return. If I'm self-forgetting, then there is no need for me to be self-forgiving. If I can do the next right thing towards others, I don't' have time to be hard on myself and therefore needing my own forgiveness. When placed before forgetting and forgiving, "self" isn't always a bad word.


