My Relapse Prevention Plan


"What sort of thinking dominates an alcoholic who repeats time after time the desperate experiment of the first drink?" Two days in a row, while working with others, I have read these words in *More About Alcoholism*. The stories of Jim, the jaywalker and Fred float through my head as I sit here typing this article.


What is my experience with relapse? I've yet to do it. Relapse is not a requirement in A.A. to have lasting sobriety. The stories in the book, the experiences of those I've seen going in and out of the rooms, the tales of "it didn't get any better" and the deaths of those that never made it back, that is my experience with relapse.


I've sponsored many women over the years who have danced with relapses; some have made it back and sobered up, some are continuously going in and out, in and out, trying to find the easier softer way and two months ago one of my girls didn't make it back to the rooms. After 5 years of in and out, this disease finally won. She was an amazing woman, a talent in her career trade, and a loving mother, none of which could keep her sober. Alcoholism does not discriminate.

All these examples add up to the reason why I keep my nose in the book, my butt in the chairs, my prayers to God and the bottle far, far away! I don't need another "countless vain attempt to prove I can drink like other people." I am an alcoholic! To remain sober, I need God and the fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous.


