

Tradition One - Unity

Some dictionary definitions for Unity are: the quality or state of not being multiple; a number multiplication by which it leaves any element of a system unchanged; a condition of harmony: accord; continuity without deviation or change; the quality or state of being made one: unification; a totality of related parts. There were times in my early life when I was applying this principle and was unaware of it. Like when I was being an active part of my family, involved in the Boy Scouts, on sports teams, being in a fraternity in college.

Also during these times I was developing my bad attitude, was being selfish and self-centered and my prejudices and opinions were being formed. The more that these principles were being developed, the worse that I behaved and acted out. Then, liquor was poured over this mess so I could hide the way I was feeling and reacting to the way I was living. Like a dog chasing its tail.

The time came when the reality of the way I was living really started to bother me. I was getting farther from my family, even though I was around physically. I started to lie, cheat and steal more than I had done previously. I finally got fed up and wanted to find out what I was doing wrong with my life and myself. I sought help.

So I went to treatment and was introduced to AA and the Fellowship. I had not expected that my problems were of my own making. I took myself with me wherever I went. My mind and thinker were my dilemma. Heck, I thought that the drinking and the other chemicals were my problem. Boy what a misguided thought that was for me to have. I was participating in my own downfall and I had no clue of it.

The program of action – the Twelve Steps worked, my sponsor helped to get my thinking and actions changed. A spiritual awakening I got as a result of doing the program of action in my daily life. It was here in AA that "spiritual principles" were introduced to me so I could maybe understand them. This change in living did not take place overnight.

In order for me to continue to change my thinking and living I was shown the Twelve Traditions. I found these as a result of having a home group, being of service, helping others, and trying to be a member in good standing in my home group. Here is where the principle of UNITY was given to me.

I was not so unique, nor the individual that I thought that I had been for so long. There were others that had similar experiences and we were a lot alike. I was a part of a whole group of people. Since this principle was given to me I am a better member of the family that I tried to be distant from mentally. I am a better employee. I try to bring something to my job and employer, than ask what's in it for me. I am a better husband and stepdad. And I continually try to be of service in the Fellowship of AA.

If this program is continuing to give me new principles with which to live by then I'd better be trying to practice them within the fellowship and in all my affairs. Like a friend from Georgia says, "Being another bozo on the bus," is good enough for me now these days.




