Tradition Four Autonomy, Autonomous

Reino F, DCM

The definition of Autonomy is "the quality or state of being self-governing". Autonomous is "undertaken or carried out without outside control", "existing or capable of existing independently". Tradition Four states that each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or AA as a whole.

Bill wrote that "Our Traditions are a guide to better ways of working and living, and they are an antidote for our various maladies. The Twelve Traditions are to the group survival and harmony what AA's Twelve Steps are to each member's sobriety and peace of mind ... But the Twelve Traditions also point straight at many of our individual defects. By implication they ask each of us to lay aside pride and resentment. They ask for personal as well as group sacrifice ... The Traditions guarantee the equality of all members ... They show us how we may best relate ourselves to each other and to the world."

It is interesting that I was unaware that I had come into AA with selfishness and self-centeredness. I very seldom ever considered anyone else in making plans, decisions or taking actions. My side of the issue was what was the most important part. My motives and actions clearly showed others what my intentions were before and after the fact. The AA members here before me had to show me how my motives and actions affected all those around me. This was quite a process for me to see and then accept this about myself.

It was through a sponsor, a home group and a network of members that became friends that they told me the truth about my behavior and not what I wanted to hear that changes in my behavior started to make progress.

I gradually worked on being concerned for others and their perceptions and less about me then life and my perceptions started to change. Being of service to others, the group and AA as a whole I became less self-centered. This Tradition helped me understand that I could not take any actions harmful to others without dire consequences to myself. I learned that nothing was really good unless other people also were considered. I am no longer autonomous in my own right as much as I was originally.

Sobriety must be my sole objective. In all respects there is perfect freedom of will and action. We have the right to be wrong, but we no longer have the right to harm others.

So gradually over the years the way I thought and acted when I came to you has changed to me being a member, thinking and working with others instead of for my own ends. I was always feeling alone and now I am a part of something bigger than me alone. So now I need to act like I am part of something and one of its members.

I need to be of service to the still suffering alcoholics in and out of AA. I have realized that eventually we must conform to whatever tested principles guarantee survival. The freedom individual groups have in this tradition carries with it the admonition to protect the fellowship as a whole.

When we started my home group, we went to the group that was already meeting at the church to ask if they were willing to let us meet there. We did not want to get in the way of an already established group meeting there. The group said they were ok with our proposed format and that it would not be in their way. They were very gracious. So, we are meeting at that church.

Seeing years later how this Tradition can be applied was very eye opening and participating in practicing the Traditions' principles also is very satisfying.

Being a part of something requires self-sacrifice and willingness to practice spiritual principles in our daily lives so we can be a part of something bigger than us as individuals. And, we get to make personal progress as we trudge the road to happy destiny.
