


to transport all the containers of District 40 items that we might need, and let me tell you we should have looked through it all and just took what we needed but again we were new to this so we took everything. We all arrived at


Can anyone register for a SETA G Suite account?

- Purpose: The purpose of the literature committee is to raise the awareness for AA conference approved literature, audiovisual, and other special items.
 - At our last area committee meeting, we discussed putting together a packet of selected pamphlets for the purpose of leading and presenting at group meetings. We are reviewing the pamphlets as a committee and will select the 10 pamphlets and will determine display folder ideas for the presentation sets.
 - This month features the pamphlet "The Jack Alexander Article About A.A.: The Article That Marked a Milestone in the History of A.A". The article, entitled "Alcoholics Anonymous" was published in the Saturday Evening Post issue of March 1, 1941. Although one national article has been published previously, the Post report on the handful of men and women who had achieved sobriety through A.A. was largely responsible for the surge of interest that established the Society on a national and international basis. In 1941, Jack Alexander reported upon the sense of humility and service that distinguished the A.A. program and those who then practiced it, and the same awareness of our need to continue to serve fellow alcoholics in a spirit of helpfulness and humility remains the cornerstone of our Society.
