

District 40 Literature Rep Report- April 12th, 2022

- Purpose: The purpose of the literature committee is to raise the awareness for AA conference approved literature, audiovisual, and other special items.
- The Area literature committee met on March 16th at 8:30pm via Zoom.
 - 7 attendees
 - Our chair, Hilton L., shared his experience at the Unity Conference he attended in February, and that he distributed 9 pamphlet packets.
 - Alt. Chair Dan K. shared his experience attending the area 2023 budget meeting, in which the Literature Committee budget was approved at a slight increase based on current chair's experience.
 - We had the opportunity to review Agenda Item K and submit our feedback to Kris
 our delegate. The committee had a spirited discussion on the potential plain
 language edition. Great viewpoints were raised on both the pro and con side, but
 no substantial unanimity was reached on whether to continue with the plain
 language edition or not. We did our best to inform, not instruct!

- Also, the committee voted to submit our pamphlet packet project to GSO to consider as a Literature workbook item, so we will work on that in the coming months!
- This month's pamphlet is The Twelve Steps Illustrated: https://www.aa.org/twelve-steps-illustrated
- This pamphlet is a simple, yet powerful pamphlet containing visual depictions for each step, with each capturing the emotions often found stirred when working through the steps.
 - Next Area Literature meeting on Zoom, May 17th, 2022 @ 8:30PM
- This month's pamphlet is Bridging The Gap- Between treatment and A.A. through contact programs: https://aa.org/assets/en_US/aa-literature/p-49-bridging-the-gapbetween-treatment-and-aa-through-temporary-contact-programs
- Part of Bridging the Gap between and treatment program and A.A. is the Temporary Contact Program, which is designed to help the alcoholic in an alcoholism treatment program make that transition.
- The pamphlet describes "between the door of the facility and the nearest A.A. group or meeting" as one of the more slippery places in the journey to sobriety.
- In order to bridge this gap, A.A. members have volunteered to be temporary contacts and introduce newcomers to Alcoholics Anonymous.
- The video "Hope: Alcoholics Anonymous" shown to patients in treatment, emphasizes
 the importance of having a temporary contact as the essential link between treatment
 and recovery.
- It is suggested that the temporary contact take the newcomer to a variety of A.A. meetings and introduce them to other A.As, gain contact info for other A.A.s and share the experience of sponsorship and a home group.

- The pamphlet then discusses guidelines for temporary contacts to follow. One
 interesting guideline is that you need not have experience with treatment settings. Your
 qualifications are experience as an alcoholic and recovery in A.A.
