

What can I say but it is good to get back to in person events. I started my trip with a few friends driving to Hobby airport. What a surprise, when we are walking through the



airport, we start running into others from our area. We had time to sit and talk before the flight and also before the flight home. It is like the meeting before and after the meeting.

What is a service assembly you might ask yourself, it was a lot of workshops on many different topics ranging from the traditions, the concepts, different positions, different committees, Technology and our history. Let's face it I love the history of AA, to know where we came from to make sure we learn from those lessons, rule 62 comes to mind. But again, the meeting before and after, the people we talk to before, during and after those workshops are an added bonus. I heard about springtime in the Ozarks, and I think I will try to go next year. I think it was when I was sitting in one of the hospitality suites, where you grab a cup of coffee or a snack and sit down and just join in the conversation. It is nice to be surrounded by others that love AA as much as I do.

Let's get into some of the workshops, I started out in technology in AA, thinking it may shed some more light on the current technologies but it went through the evolution of technology from the beginning and that started with a telephone call from Bill to Dr Bob. I have the PowerPoint from that I will put out in the D4O share when it gets setup. There were even radio shows like "We the People" that publicized AA but that was before the traditions. If this is your thing you should look at natw.org.

The GSR workshop, this was a key one along with the DCM I wanted to attend. To see what new information I could use to get the new GSRs in the next rotation a head start. I will have to say it was a lot of what I heard when I came in and what we send out now. The GSR position in the service manual lists all the material you should read and understand, and as a newcomer coming into AA has a better chance of understanding the program when they get a sponsor, a service sponsor can help the transition of a new GSR into service. I remember I heard that I should get one

at my first District 40 meeting. It has helped me out and we still meet a few times a month. One of the things that always stayed with me and I don't remember where I read it but the GSR is the keeper of Traditions in their home group. They talked at this workshop about strengthening your group, relying on the resources available to you like your service sponsor, elder statesmen, DCM, Area Chair, GSO, Box 459 and the service manual. Also the pamphlets you get in your GSR kit, like the home group, P 28 "informed group conscience" that is right after it talks about the spirit of rotation. But it is one the most important positions in

AA, the conduit between your home group and AA as a whole. That is why I will like to see what District 40 can do in the coming rotation on increasing our GSRs attendance at area assemblies.

The DCM workshop had some great ideas in this one. It's all about communication, to and from the GSRs and getting out to the quiet groups. We will look into setting up an outreach committee to go visit those groups that do not have a current GSR or maybe not even a registered group with GSO. The District's job is to keep the groups informed even if they don't have a GSR. Also, I would like to have a portion in the D40 meeting for the GSRs to tell us about their group. To have a GSR sharing session to discuss topics on any



issue at their home group and let the GSRs share their experience, strength and hope on those issues they have dealt with. I have already started my list of other incoming DCMs that were there that I talked with, ate with and shared our expectations with on our rotation as DCMs.

Involving the alternate sounded like I could learn some good skills on working with Mike B in our rotation. It covered a lot of what Jackie has done with me over these past 2 years. Keeping them included in all correspondence and going over the agenda before they are sent out. Everything in AA should be transparent and if something would happen to me Mike should have all the information at his disposal if needed. Go over their Job description and see if anything needs to be added or changed. But this workshop was geared to alt delegates but they made exceptions due to many of us being incoming DCMs and Alt DCMS. It boils down to us as your DCM and Alt DCM need to work together to make this district the best we can and that can only be done with everyone's cooperation.

I did buy the whole weekend's audio so I can reply to them as a matter of fact I need to upload them on my phone so I can listen to them to and from work. but I think it was the past trustees that really got me. A past class A, a non-alcoholic, went through a story and talked about her service

sponsor and her service manual that had notes in it from her service sponsor like "read this again" and "don't skip this". If you did not know, every class A has to get a service sponsor and go through the tradition and concepts so they know how this society functions. She quoted the Jesuits a few times and it was a great way to sum up this program. The one that still stays with me is what is service? It is what your prayer life looks like when it gets up on its knees and walks around.

Now get your calendars out and start making plans for Oct II-13, 2024 it will be in Richardson Texas, outside Dallas and 2 years later in Houston. This will be a great way to get more members in your home group into what service is.



The A.A. Fellowship is nonprofessional and available at no cost; its primary purpose is the personal recovery and continued sobriety of those alcoholics who turn to it for help. The A.A. approach is based on the ability of recovered alcoholics to help those who are still drinking.
