I am looking forward to this next stage in my service and see what we can accomplish in this next rotation.



- · who have had equally diverse experiences with alcohol. What they have in common is that all of
- them came to grips with their alcoholism around the age of 60. They began drinking at different
- periods in their lives. They drank for various lengths of time. Their backgrounds and
- circumstances were different. One man drank alcoholically only two and a half years another
- · drank for 50 years. Several drank to ease the loneliness when a spouse died, one to ease the
- · tensions of a high-powered career. One woman, who went directly from the cardiac care unit to
- · detox, merely switched from vodka to white wine. These stories illustrate that alcoholism comes
- in many different forms and in a variety of disguises. Whether or not you are an alcoholic is not
- · determined by where you drink, when you started drinking, how long you've been drinking, with
- whom you drink, what you drink, or 5 even how much you drink. The true test is in the answer
- to this question: What has alcohol done to you? If it has affected your relationships with your
- family, friends, or former or present employers; if it has influenced the way you schedule your
- days; if it has affected your health; if it determines or affects your moods or your state of mind
 when not drinking; if you are in any way preoccupied with alcohol then the likelihood is that
- · you may have a problem
