District Meeting

I heard a few times during the collection process of the district inventory what the district monthly meeting should or should not do. Here is the blueprint of what we have to do. I thought I should just put this out there so everyone could see where we are starting from. Below is copied straight out of our District 40 Policies & Procedures Manual.

DISTRICT COMMITTEE OPERATIONS.

This section is a compilation of procedures and processes from the experience of the District Committee. It is the "who, what, where, when, why, and how" of the conduct of District business. As in any business of A.A., these guidelines can be changed at any time with informed discussion and vote of approval by substantial unanimity (2/3) of the District Committees' conscience.

District Meeting and Responsibilities

- 1. The committee shall meet monthly at a time and place approved by the District Committee members.
- 2. The meeting will be of sufficient duration to effectively conduct the business of the District Committee.
- 3. The District Committee meeting will be chaired by the DCM or in their absence, the Alternate DCM. The Chair keeps the meeting on track to accomplish the Agenda Items, ensuring that informed decisions are achieved.
- 4. The DCM will prepare an Agenda for District business.
- 5. The agenda will consist of the introduction of members (roll call), approval of the Minutes, Treasurers' reports, Committee reports, GSR group reports, unfinished business, and new business.
- 6. Additional items, special projects and order of presentation is at the discretion of the DCM.
- 7. The District Secretary will prepare the minutes in summary form, and issue them to the DCM for review, and approval before distribution.
- 8. The District Roster is maintained and provided by the Secretary.
- 9. The Treasurer will prepare the Treasurers' report no less than one (1) week before the upcoming District Meeting for DCM's review, and approval before distribution. Treasurer will provide "hard copy' reports at each District Meeting.
- 10. District Reps will present reports of Area Committees and will be responsible for activities associated with those Committees.
- 11. Any proposed amendments to this document shall be submitted in writing to the DCM, at least one week before the next District meeting to be presented to the District committee for consideration.
- 12. Approved amendments will be recorded in Exhibit C of this document, noting the change with the approved date, and then be posted on District's 40 web page.

I hope this might shed light on how the district meeting is set up. I know there is a lot of information that a GSR has to consume in a short amount of time but that is why getting a good service sponsor to help you through the other 2 legacies of AA is paramount. You will notice that a service sponsor is referenced in a lot of the chapters in the new service manual. SETA does have a web page (GSR_PAGE) that might become a good resource for you. If you might still have any questions please reach out to me on my SETA email and I will get back to you.







Solution: Written & Published

What's so great about March? The message in print being written and published, that's what!

District Inventory: I'd be remiss if I didn't mention this. The inventory went well, thanks in part to Wayne H. facilitating, and in large part to your participation! Because of the consistency of the feedback from the questions sent back from the Groups, there really wasn't much more to expound upon during the actual inventory. Thank you again to Wayne H. and every Group that participated in helping to move our District more in line with what you, the Groups, want it to be. But the work is not done. Next step is for you, the Groups, to determine how we, the District, should move forward to address what came out of the inventory. Willingness without action is fantasy.

District Meeting Location AdHoc: AdHoc should be meeting again soon, hopefully. It is possible we will find a temporary location soon, until we can find a more central location for our monthly meeting. We want to be as accessible as we can to as many Groups in our District as we can but want to adhere to our District's decision to be hybrid for the 2023 calendar year. More to come!

Now, back to why March is so important in our history. Our message in print. The solution, written for the first time, to alcoholism. A portion we should all be familiar with....

"Remember that **we deal with alcohol**—cunning, baffling, powerful! Without help it is too much for us. But there is One who has all power—**that One is God**. May you find Him now!" Pg 58-59 Alcoholics Anonymous – Chapter 5: How It Works

The writing for our book began in March of 1938, and was published a year later in March of 1939. Of note is our 2nd printing was also in March of 1941. Fun fact: Bill Wilson's sobriety date was December of 1934 which means he was 3 years sober when he sat down to write Alcoholics Anonymous. The section quoted above tells us so much, but we may hear it so much we don't fully digest its meaning. What do we deal with? What are its features? Are we powerless over it? If we're powerless, where can we find the needed Power? It was answered in the previous chapter.

"Well, that's exactly what **this book is about**. **Its main object** is to enable you to find a Power greater than yourself which will solve your problem. That means we have written a book which we believe to be spiritual as well as moral. And it means, of course, that we are going to talk about **God**." Pg 45 Alcoholics Anonymous – Chapter 4: We Agnostics


Couldn't be written any more clear than that. The steps outlined later in Chapter 5 give us the solution to alcoholism. And my hope, as was Bill's, is that you discover....

Who are We? —Area #67 and District #40 - See Boundaries below



Glad My Luck Ran Out

This newcomer mom's got a new tattoo and she's shopping for a bike. She's sober now and living large

I grew up in a small town where drinking was simply part of life. You didn't have a party without lots of beer.

Over the years, my drinking increased and then even more when I discovered chardonnay wine. I wouldn't just drink one glass at 5:00 P.M.—I drank a bottle and sometimes more. I'm a nervous person, so my excuse was that I wanted something to calm me down.

Soon my husband unhappily assumed the position of regulating my drinking. He was forced to put a lock on the liquor cabinet and take away my car keys so I couldn't drive off and buy more. Sometimes I'd find the hidden keys, or often I just walked to the store to get more alcohol. My family begged me to get help with my drinking, but I was sure I could drink like a normal person. My husband warned me that my luck would run out some day, and eventually that day came.

One night after he fell asleep, I found the car keys and I drove off to get more wine. I don't remember leaving the house, buying the wine or being stopped by the police. I do have some memories of what happened at the police station. I had to be held down by several officers in order for them to draw my blood for an alcohol test. My husband resentfully posted my bail. When I was released from jail, he informed me that I was going to rehab. I didn't argue. I knew he was right.

Overall, my stay at rehab was good. But the first few days without wine in the evening caused me to turn mean. I argued with resident assistants about their rules. In one situation I had the bright idea to say I needed to skip the evening AA meeting so I could work on my Steps. I threw a temper tantrum to try to get my way. I made the staff summon my therapist and call the resident assistant but, in the end, I didn't get my way. I went to the AA meeting that evening—and enjoyed it. I envied the young and beautiful women there who had found sobriety. Some of them even had tattoos, piercings and colored hair.

While I was sitting there in the meeting, it occurred to me how disrespectfully I had treated the resident assistants. I tried to think how I could apologize. When I returned from the AA meeting one of the assistants asked what I thought of the meeting, and I replied, "It was #@!*ing dope," which was funny coming out of an older woman's mouth. Then I told him that he had passed the test, that I was really a spy placed at rehab. I was there to see if he would let an alcoholic push him around. He didn't and he passed the test. We laughed and became friends after that.

I'm home now and I'm really enjoying being sober. I got a hummingbird tattoo on my back and a nose piercing. I also took a motorcycle license class with my husband. He passed but I didn't. We are currently looking for a used motorcycle so I can practice and retake my test. I also took a handgun safety class, where I scored the highest for shooting at the target. I can't wait to see what my Higher Spirit will let me experience next. I'm so thankful for the new life I have. And it helps that it's one I can now remember.
