Primary Purpose

Tradition Five: Each group has but one primary purpose—to carry its message to the alcoholic who still suffers. – Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions Pg 150

Tradition five is <u>one</u> of my favorites, and since it's the fifth month, I figured I would write a little on it.

The long form in the Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions (Pg 190) is: Five—Each Alcoholics Anonymous group ought to be a spiritual entity *having but one primary purpose*—that of

carrying its message to the alcoholic who still suffers.

I thought it was trivial when I got sober and was first introduced to our basic text (Alcoholics Anonymous), but thanks to good sponsorship, I was encouraged to understand what I was reading. This was done by using a dictionary and other literature aids. It was pointed out to me Bill's use of the em dash. It can create emphasis or be used to end a thought and begin a new one. Something closely related to this tradition is this statement in Alcoholics Anonymous (Pg 58-59)

"Remember that we deal with alcohol-cunning, baffling, powerful!"

This one was used for emphasis. What do we deal with? Alcohol. What are its features? Cunning, baffling, powerful! We don't deal with anything else. What is the ingredient necessary to be an alcoholic? Its in the name. **This is what we're good at.** I may, personally, know a lot about a lot of things. But that is not what I am called to do in the 12th step. Carry **this** message to alcoholics. What is the message? The message our basic text, Alcoholics Anonymous, carries. This <u>includes</u> the spiritual program of action outlined in our twelve steps. The group is the spiritual entity with which the message can be carried. Not my mess, the message. That's the emphasis here in this tradition—carry its message to the alcoholic who still suffers. Whether newcomer, middle timer or old timer, the qualification here is the **alcoholic** that is still suffering.

As always, please let me know how I can be of service to your group in better carrying out our primary purpose!

Rick's purpose at this meeting was to solicit feedback from groups and committees concerning Agenda Items for the 73rd General Service Conference which will be held in New York the week of April 24-29, 2023. The

following are the instructions he gave to GSRs and DCMs to use when reviewing the agenda items:

- Have your group/committee review the conference agenda and pick three items (or more if you so desire) that are important to your group/committee and have a thorough discussion of these items.
- Using the provided feedback form, let me know if the group/committee agrees or disagree with the item.
- · Include any comments in the comments section you feel are pertinent and/or informative.
- The form is fillable, so you can save it and fill it out electronically. Then email it to me or
- · Print it out and fill in by hand. Either scan it and email it or send me a photo of it.

Rick would like to have this information before April 24 if possible. A note from Rick: I truly appreciate your time and consideration in this matter. Thank you for your participation in the Conference process.

Clarification concerning the 5th edition of the Big Book versus the Plain Language Translation Big Book: The 4th edition of the Big Book was published in 2000 and typically AA does another edition around every twenty years or so. The 5th edition Big Book will contain the original "first 164 pages" unchanged except for some statistics about membership and it will contain a new Forward. The goal is to release this book at the 2025 International Conference.

The Plain Language Big Book was voted in by the 71st GSC. This book is being written for a reader with a fifth grade reading comprehension and the writing has been in progress for two years. At the 73rd GSC, each Delegate will have one hour to review the new Forward, The Doctor's Opinion, and the first six chapters. This will be done in a secluded room with no electronics allowed. During the 73rd GSC, the entire Conference will get to vote 1) Approve, 2) Not Approve, OR 3) Send it back to Trustees for further review.

Just as an FYI, a subcommittee of three trustees (Jimmy D. is the Chair) have been meeting with the translators every two weeks.

Question: Is the Plain Language Book being written to compete with other publishing companies that are writing plain language books? No

Question/Statement: AA has been allowing other publishers to write our history books. I think it is more important to write our own history book instead of the Plain Language Book. Rick's reply: Good idea, maybe good idea for the 74th GCS.

Question: How much has already been spent on the Plain Language Book and what is the completed cost? Rick: I don't know.

Rick: "Two Trustees asked for the resignation before the regular meeting. Ms. Chezem went to her room. The two Trustees typed a letter of resignation, took it to her room, where she signed it and 2/3s of the Board Members voted to accept it.

We are still currently compiling all the answers that were sent in and those additional items gathered at the District Inventory meeting. Once it is finished, I will send it out in the next D40 mail out.

GSC Agenda Items

I have not heard back from any of our GSRs on agenda items that your group wanted to discuss. I have selected a few and one I am sure to bring up some debate over the plain language version on Big Book 4th edition.
