VIII. Finance Committee - David H

Out of all the line items having expenses in this budget, 12 are lower than last year, 6 remained the same, and 11 increased a little. Room rates will be slightly higher for whichever hotel we choose. Please take copies of the budget back to your groups for discussion and then approval at the July Assembly. There will be a workshop at the July assembly for the budget. Hopefully this will help the approval process go more quickly.

IX. Announcements – Betsy G (for Terri V)

Contingent on approval at GSO for a webcast viewing of the Flag Ceremony at the International Conference, a proposal was given to the Finance Committee for approval of spending a maximum of \$320 (\$80/hr for up to 4 hours) rent to view this webcast. The Finance Committee's recommendations will be brought up tomorrow.

The Interim SCAP Chair has requested SETA provide her with mailing labels of people who have registered for the SETA convention and would be used to send out flyers. This will be put up for a motion and voted on tomorrow.

At the July Assembly we're going to have a report from Charles on the General Service Conference; we're going to have a budget workshop on the proposed 2006 budget, and I've asked District 32 to put on a Traditions Play which they wrote and will perform at a workshop.

Debra R will not be able to attend the International Convention, and needs to step down and have someone else elected as representative.

For the July Assembly, those committees eligible for suites are Literature, Multi-Lingual, and PI. If you don't want a suite, please let me know. Our July Host District will be District 70. We want to thank District 51 for all their hard work in hosting the Assembly this weekend.
